




**Parent/Carer Questionnaire Feedback

This questionnaire represents the Parent/Carer voice across our school.


My child is happy at school

My child feels safe at school





The school ensures its children are well behaved




All parents said they felt positive or had no concerns about this statement and we are delighted to see the ongoing impact of our Positive Behaviour approach.

92% of parents strongly agreed that the school's ethos and values have a good impact on their child, with a further 8% responding neutrally. This reflects a high level of parental confidence in the school's culture and its positive influence on pupils.

The school makes me aware of what my child will learn during the year








When we have raised concerns with the school
they have been dealt with correctly.





The school lets me know how my child is doing




We are pleased that 98% of our parents/carers feel that they receive useful information that enables them to work in partnership with us because they understand how their child is doing.




My child learns a range of subjects





The school helps my child to take part in a wide range of activities, clubs and experiences.



Our Pupil Survey is very encouraging, showing that 98% of our parents know how to keep their child safe online.

Improvement opportunities for our school to consider included:


- Continue to embed life skills and wellbeing programs.

- Continue to support disadvantaged access.






Does your child have Special Educational Needs and/or disabilities (SEND)?

This now means that parents have better communication and their voice is heard but also they are well informed about what is happening for their child.

Have you noticed any factors that could prevent your child, or others, from feeling included and fully participating in school due to aspects such as culture, language, ability or background?


Key insights:

- Offer financial support schemes for resources and activities.


I understand the value that being part of the Learning Academy Partnership brings to the school



We are now 1 year and a term into our journey as part of Learning Academy Partnership (LAP).

There are many areas of school life which have changed. We have most recently had our EYFS area refurbished and now have new flooring and a roof! Our youngest children get to be outside in provision for so much longer every day and it is wonderful to see. We have also had funding from LAP to buy new outdoor resources. Throughout the rest of the school, we have new doors and carpets throughout, making our learning environment so much better.
